



### JYE S.R.L.

Juan Quarleri and Eduardo Marchionni decided to go into the elevator industry in 1996 and started JYE. As experts in automation and industrial control, the company concentrated its efforts on the development and manufacture of electronic boards, and added several indicator models. An electronic control based on serial control-area-network communication will be launched soon. Only two wires will be necessary to connect its two components: one is located in the car and the other in the machine room. J.Y.E.'s market range is Argentina and Mexico.

Maldatec La Plata SA of The Maldatec Group exhibited an MRL system driven by an Italian Sassi machine. The innovation was the Commander SK, an AC-inverter drive with an optional programmable module that allows the elevator control panel to be integrated within the drive. Some of its advantages include an absence of additional control boards, wiring savings with simplified connections, compact design and an overall increase in system robustness. Imported heavy-duty geared machines used for special installations - 120 mpm and 1050 kilograms - were showcased together with cars and imported push buttons.

Mamut SA - Mizzau SA - Elesor SA's 49-year-old trademark is a mammoth, which could be seen above the company's booth. The company manufactures complete manual and automatic elevator doors, with integrated photoelectrical cells, a full-size range of VVVF operators and landing-door operators. Visitors could check out

model doors and big six-panel central-opening gates. To emphasize the company's national character, Mamut uses raw material supplied by the Argentine Siderar SA and electronics developed by Ingeniería Wilcox S.H.

Reductores Argentinos SRL, an elevator-machine manufacturer, has been in the local market for 35 years. Its factory was recently automated and furnished with modern lathes and a new Hyundai machining center. With this new technology and a staff of 30, machines and motors are manufactured on the premises. The company exports most of its products, but the Piccola 360 and RA-K2, one- and two-speed VVVF drives, are mostly requested in Latin America. A year ago, Reductores Argentinos complied with ISO 9001 requirements, earning the quality certification.
